

Everything described in this package is included within the total price of the package as described. Breakfast, lunch and dinner, with every meal there are no limits whatsoever when it comes to food and drinks. In addition, both lunch and dinner are warm and very comprehensive meals. Also, accommodation is provided, night before the start of the tour and the night after the last day of the tour. You can leave your wallet at home. From experience, we know this is the most practical and comfortable way. The only thing you have to do as our guest is riding your bike. Besides that you will have the opportunity to fully enjoy the nature, culture, the unique Georgian hospitality and the amazing cuisine and the drinks to go along with that.

On the road, we will visit a lot of sights; century old churches and other buildings but also the most amazing viewing points where you will be in awe of its beauty. There are basically a lot to mention that is why you will not find all of them back in the day-to-day plan you will find below. Nevertheless, visiting these sights is a must to seep in the unique culture of the country.

Arrival day: First of all, we will personally pick you up from the airport and bring you to the accommodation in Tbilisi. Depending on the time of day there is the possibility to get a tour through the city. In the evening, we enjoy our first of many traditional Georgian dishes.



Day 1: We ride to Kakheti, Georgia's most famous wine region. Sinuous roads take us to the most amazing points to overlook the Kakhetian dessert and the wine yards the region is so famous for. The curvy and windy roads take us to Signaghi, a small beautifully restored town. We lunch with a sight combining the steppe area and the view on Signaghi. After Signaghi we ride on to Telavi, the regions capital, a cute town in which life seems to surround itself with wine. At our accommodation, home-made wine is ready, as well as all the Kakhetian specialities.

Day 2: From Kakheti in the East we are going to head up North; Kazbegi is the next destination. A mountainous region with peaks up to 5000 meter high. Views on this ride are just stunning. Mountain passes go up and down as they take you from corner to corner, a true Walhalla for any motorcycle enthusiast. Our accommodation offers the same views over the hilltops to allow us to enjoy the spectacular views through the night.

Day 3: The hometown of the former leader of the USSR is up next. After riding through the mountains landscapes change quickly, the natural diversity the country is known for. We take a small road to Gori to avoid the highway, the road is filled with beautiful colors of roadside



flowers and views of endless hills and mountains. In Gori we pay a visit to the museum that attempts to document Joseph Stalin's life. We spent the night in Gori, with great food in local restaurants and homemade wines at our accommodation.

Day 4: Next up: Zugdidi. We leave Gori behind us and head West. Zugdidi is situated in Mingrelia, a culturally and linguistically separated region with its own fabulous cuisine. The nature on both sides of the road changes as the Black Sea approaches. On our way to Zugdidi we pass Kutaisi, Georgia's legislative capital. The best restaurant in town will provide our lunch. We dine with traditional Georgian dishes and get ready for our trip to Svaneti!



Day 5: One of the most spectacular roads in the whole Caucasus. A newly made road in a region that has been culturally separated for centuries. Even the Soviets could never fully exert their influence because of its remoteness. This is how Svaneti still feels like a different world. Also, it's why they were able to keep their customs and pagan traditions intact. On the road,

old watchtowers will pop-up. Svan families own these towers and in the old days they were used to settle disputes which in practice meant shooting from one tower to the other. It's a place to be in awe and the stories about the Svan customs are impressive. One of the Georgian customs the Svans also hold is the love for amazing food.



Day 6: From Svaneti we ride to Racha, also known as Lower Svaneti. As the crow flies it seems a small ride, but lucky for us the only way to get there is to circle around it on the best windy roads. Tsageri is our final destination. With the Svanetian mountains at the background, Racha seems like a peaceful alpine region. The combination of green and sloping mountains and the high snowcapped ones is beautiful.



Day 7: We continue to circle around Racha. First we visit Oni, an extremely peaceful and authentic village. The whole region is quite undiscovered by tourists which makes it a great experience to ride through. If there are tourists it will mostly be Georgians that know exactly the beauty that the region has to offer. Stereotypes say that people from Racha are known for their calmness and to always take it easy. And this is exactly the vibe the area has. We spent the night a little more down South, in Imereti.

Day 8: We depart for Tbilisi. On the way sceneries, will change quickly as climates and wheather conditions alter quickly in the small country. We visit the centuries old Jvari monestary which has a



view down on the old capital of Georgia; Mtskheta. Back in Tbilisi we eat at one of the most authentic restaurants in town where old men often sing to honor their country, friends, and family. For a night cap, we visit the only real biker bar in town.
