Day 1: We start of in Kakheti, the most famous wine region in Georgia, the cradle of wine. Its characterized by its endless steppe plains and beautiful wine yards. The roads we take subtly carve through the area, taking us over many mountain passes and through amazing landscapes. Our route is full of beautiful corners that will get you will acquainted with your bike quickly. We visit Telavi first, the regions capital. Before we arrive there is lunch looking over where we the steppe plains and the Kakhetian mountains. Our last destination for the day is Signaghi, the regions capital. We will try the wines that come from the same fields as where we saw the grapes were grown.



Day 2: From Kakheti in the East we are going to head up North; Kazbegi is the next destination. A mountainous region with peaks up to 5000 meter high. Views on this ride are just stunning. Mountain passes go up and down as they take you from corner to corner, a true Walhalla for any motorcycle enthusiast. Our accommodation offers views over the mountaintops to enjoy the spectacular views of the famous Gergeti church through the night.

Day 3: We ride to Borjomi, famous for its lush and green sights. Also, its famous for its Spa and “healing” water. The reputation for the Borjomi’s water went that far that during the USSR the Soviet Elite came to Borjomi to rest and heal. Talking about Soviet elite; we visit the hometown of the former leader of the USSR before we get to Borjomi. Joseph Stalin was born in Gori, we pay a visit to the museum that attempts



to document Joseph Stalins life. We spent the night in Borjomi, with the best local food.

Day 4: Sceneries will change once again. Uncomparable to the Kazbegi mountains we will ride true the Lower Svanetian mountains; better known as the region Racha. Even for Georgian standards Racha is a quit undiscovered territory. The local population is known for its relaxed

attitude and the nature and amazingly situated roads will give you exactly this chill out vibe. It also makes that you will experience the untouched and authentic rural Georgia.

Day 5: We rest for the day at Temuri’s amazing guesthouse. He builds all you see himself and is not afraid to talk about the bear and wolf skins that are up the wall and more importantly, how they got there. Also for those interested there is the option to visit the springs and gorgeous lakes that Racha has to offer.

Day 6: As we circled in Racha we circle out of it and discover the last of Racha and all good it has to offer for any biker. We head towards Kutaisi, which is the legislative capital of Georgia. A very pleasant city where we have our tasty lunch at the best restaurant in town. Further on we hit the woods surrounding Kutaisi. Situated in the same area is Martvili. The town is famous for the beautiful canyon that bears the same name. An amazing experience awaits; we canoe true the waters of the Martvili canyon. We spent the night close by.

Day 7: As the Black Sea has been approaching for a while we are finally hitting it today. First we ride through “Guria” and the amazing road that leads us through this region. After every corner a new view awaits from swamp until endless hills that are only accessible by hairpins. Soon after Guria the Black Sea and its palm trees pop up. We follow the coast line for a while until we are in Batumi. A city incomparable to any other city in Georgia and you will feel that right away. Take a dive in the refreshing sea and get ready for the night.



Day 8: Up north from Batumi is Zugdidi its situated in Mingrelia, a culturally and linguistically separated region with its own fabulous cuisine. We follow the road alongside the Black Sea again. However, now we head up North. First to Poti and then more inland to Mingrelia. Nature changes while travelling over roads with great sceneries.

Day 9: One of the most spectacular roads in the whole Caucasus. A newly made road in a region that has been culturally separated for centuries. Even the Soviets could never fully exert their influence cause of its remoteness. This is how Svaneti still feels like a different world. Also, its why they were able to keep their customs and pagan traditions intact. On the road old watchtowers will pop-up. Svan families own these towers and in the old days they were used to settle disputes which in practice meant shooting from one tower to the other. It's a place to be in awe and the stories about the Svan customs are impressive. One of the Georgian customs the Svans also hold is the love for amazing food.

Day 10: As a mountainous area Svaneti is famous for its outdoor activities as well as its unique culture. Today we can raft, mountainbike, hike or just relax. A most impressive spot to take a rest or to fully absorb the majestic nature.



Day 11: After a well-deserved rest we leave Svaneti and head to the heart of Georgia. Imereti is a treasure for cultural and natural beauty. However, for some

Day 12: Curving as Georgian roads are we depart for Tbilisi. We visit the centuries old Jvari monestary which has a view down on the old capital of Georgia; Mtskheta. Back in Tbilisi we eat at one of the most authentic restaurants in town where old men often sing to honor their country, friends, and family. For a night cap we visit the only real biker bar in town.
